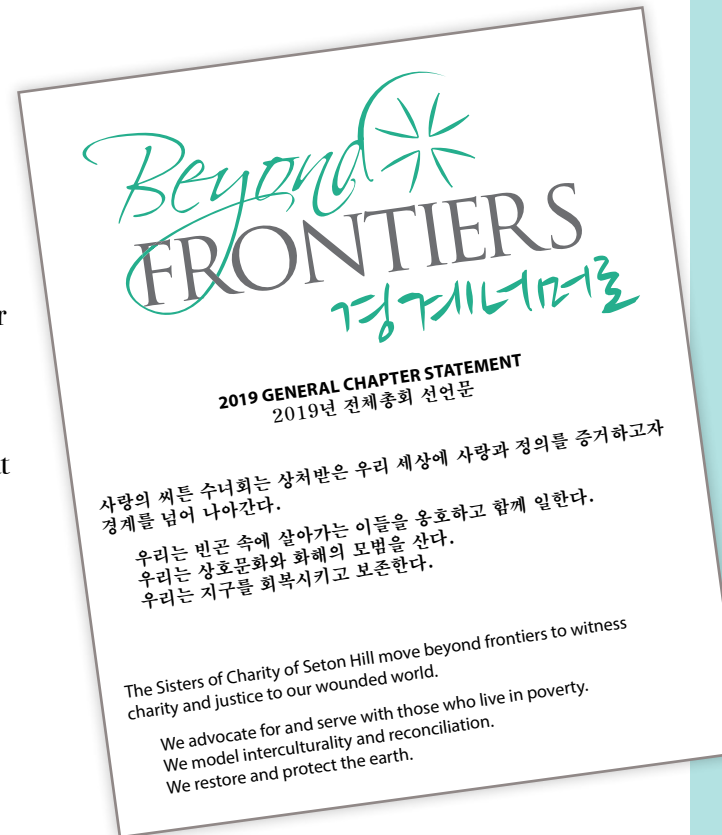


SISTERS OF CHARITY OF SETON HILL ELECT GENERAL SUPERIOR AND COUNCILORS

SISTERS AND FORMER STUDENTS CELEBRATE CHARITY LEGACY



They say that Catholic sisters never retire. They may leave the classroom, the hospital, or the parish ministry, but they always find something else to do and give their all to the work they choose. This is true for Sister Alice Ruane (formerly known as Sister Marie Timothy), a retired Sister of Charity of Seton Hill, now in her 71st year of religious life.

Sister Alice grew up in the Brookline neighborhood of Pittsburgh. The Sisters of Charity who taught her at Resurrection School and Elizabeth Seton High School instilled a strong work ethic, deep spirituality, and profound desire to serve God in Alice and her classmates. Despite a vision impairment, Sister Alice still demonstrates those virtues, finding joy and vitality in her volunteer ministries at Caritas Christi, the motherhouse of the Sisters of Charity in Greensburg.

Serving God by serving others has always been a source of fulfillment for Sister Alice. In 1960, she was one of four sisters chosen from 90 candidates to open a school for girls in South Korea. At the time, the country experienced political, social, and economic difficulties as a result of the Korean War. In the culture of that era, few families in the impoverished region could afford to send their daughters to high school. After studying the Korean language for one year, the four pioneer sisters welcomed girls to the classrooms of a school building for boys that had been vacated. Sister Alice taught music, English, and folk dancing at the newly established Saint Joseph School for girls. She ministered there until 1969 when illness necessitated her return to Greensburg. In 1974 she was again missioned to South Korea where she taught for two more years. "I was happy every day," recalled Sister Alice.

A group of 46 senior citizens (ages 50-73) that included Saint Joseph alumnae, one lay teacher, Seton Family members, and friends (including five husbands) recently celebrated the establishment of Saint Joseph School in Gangjin with its founders, the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill at Caritas Christi. The event was organized by school graduates Sister Kwang-shim Oh and Cathy Lee Rosenblum. The visitors traveled from South Korea, Canada, and distant regions of the United States to personally thank the

Sisters of Charity for their generosity to the girls who attended Saint Joseph School. The sisters who staffed the school until it closed in 2012 had empowered students to live happy and successful personal and professional lives.

Alumnae dressed in hanboks (traditional Korean dresses for special occasions) for a Mass of thanksgiving. After welcome remarks by U.S. Provincial Superior Catherine Meinert and General Superior Sung Hae Kim, the eldest graduate addressed the assembly. Ki Ok Yoon, also known by her baptismal name of Teresa, described the wonderful experiences that the Sisters of Charity provided at her beloved school. "Our education was better than any from other prestigious schools in Korea."

Most of the Korean students of the early '60s did not follow any religion. The sisters did not include religious studies in the curriculum then, but offered voluntary after-school religion lessons to satisfy their students' curiosity about faith matters. Girls who wanted to become Catholic were directed to the local church. After three years of study and with parental permission, students were received into the Church. According to Cathy Lee Rosenblum, one of the first four students to be baptized, nearly 80 percent of Saint Joseph graduates came to embrace the Catholic faith.

In her reflection on her school days, Teresa recalled the courage of her teachers and the generosity of their congregation who financed their successful mission.

“The sisters faced many difficulties—different food, language, culture, and homesickness,” she explained. “Later I realized finances were a difficulty. They depended on help from the U.S. to support the school.” She went on to describe the passion for service that the sisters instilled in their students. “Our principal, Sister Thomas Aquinas, told us to do something beautiful with our

love for God and the nation—to do small things with great love. I now realize that what I do for God and the nation is not a choice but a mission.”

Festivities continued into the afternoon with storytelling and music and ended in the evening with a Korean/American dinner. It was an exceptionally happy day for Sister Alice. “I got to pray, talk, sing, and dance all day,” she said. Perhaps finding joy in creative self-expression and her relationship with God and others is the secret to her youthful attitude and her tolerance for failing vision.

The Saint Joseph graduates and friends were sad to see their visit end. Although they are now in their senior years, they are strikingly beautiful and youthful. Cathy Lee professes, “They are physically beautiful because their teachers taught them to be spiritually beautiful.” Perhaps accepting the mission to do beautiful, small things with your love for God is the secret to a fulfilling life in the golden years.



PEN PALS FOR A SEASON, FRIENDS IN FAITH FOREVER



Sister Mary Helen O'Donnell was missioned in South Korea from 1964-1976 to teach English as a second language at Saint Joseph Middle and High School for girls in Gangjin South Korea. During that time, Soon Hee Yang, a third-year middle school student from Gwangju, wrote to Sister Mary Helen to ask if Sister would be her pen-pal, and help her learn to speak English. Soon Hee heard about Sister Mary Helen from one of her classmates, a former Saint Joseph School student who moved to Gwangju. A productive correspondence ensued, but when Sister Mary Helen left South Korea in 1976, she lost touch with Soon Hee.

At 38 years of age, Soon Hee decided to become a Catholic. She really wanted to find Sister Mary Helen to let her know that she was coming into the faith. Soon Hee recognized that the sisters who staffed her parish wore the same modified habit and cap that Sister Mary Helen wore in a photo that she kept over the years. She learned of Sister's whereabouts through those Korean sisters, who were happy to help reconnect the two pen pals.

Sister Mary Helen was pleasantly surprised to hear from her long lost pen pal after 20 years. She was happy to learn that Soon Hee had prayed the rosary for years before she embraced Catholicism. Soon Hee was a “Lady of Charity,” having spent much time in prayer and helping others at the local hospital where she worked as a lab technician. The charism of Charity consumed her and she became part of the Seton Family group in Korea and recruited friends and coworkers to join too.

Sister Mary Helen was pleased to accept an invitation to return to Korea and visit Soon Hee's family in 1996. At her baptism, Soon Hee chose the Christian name, Emmanuella (God with us). Eventually, Emmanuella's husband and her only son were also baptized. Her husband chose the name Emmanuel, and her son chose the name Andrew Kim, the name of the first canonized Korean saint. In high school, Emmanuella's son became interested in the priesthood. When he entered the seminary, Sister Mary Helen honored Emmanuella's request for prayers for her son.

Thanks to Emmanuella's generosity, Sister Mary Helen was able to travel to Korea again for Father Andrew

Kim's ordination in 2010. After his family, Sister was the first to receive his priestly blessing. He presented her with a bouquet of pink roses to thank her for her prayers and for travelling so far to attend the ordination ceremony.

In May 2019, Emmanuella and her husband traveled to the United States with the group of Saint Joseph School alumna who came to express their gratitude to the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill.

Through her translator, Emmanuella expressed that she is “overwhelmed, grateful, and proud of all that the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill did for the Korean people.” And the Sisters of Charity are equally gratified to see that their legacy of Charity lives on in their beloved students and friends.



ASSEMBLY OF THE WHOLE

The sun shone brightly in Greensburg on the morning of Wednesday, June 12, 2019. Forty-three Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill, the Archivist and the Director of Public Relations for the congregation, and one Seton Family member

gathered at 6:30 a.m. at Caritas Christi to board a bus headed for Chicago. They were embarking on an 11-hour trip to an historical event that would play out at the

Crowne Plaza Hotel over the next four days. Although Chicago greeted the Pennsylvania travelers with a heavy rain storm, spirits were high when they entered the hotel lobby. Even more sisters from both the United States and Korean Provinces were there to greet them. Hundreds of sisters, associates, archivists, and communicators from the other 13 congregations that comprise the Sisters of Charity Federation were checking in as well. All were gathered for the first-ever Assembly of the Whole, “Weaving Together Unstoppable Charity.”

After a restful night and a good breakfast, many of the sisters enjoyed sight-seeing on Thursday, June 13. Some were involved with

preparatory meetings and rehearsals for the events of the next three days. At 7:00 p.m., however, each participant gathered in the huge conference space at an assigned table where she would represent her congregation with tablemates from various Federation communities. Our own Sister Grace Hartzog, Executive Director of the Federation, welcomed 550 participants to the Assembly and shared a brief history of the Federation through stories and photos.

The Opening Ritual that followed portrayed the Assembly’s theme with beautiful pageantry. Representatives from each congregation processed to the front of the hall according to the date that the community entered the Federation. Each congregation presented a banner with its logo and a long colored banner. Together, the logos were posted and the colored banners woven together on the large front dais. Then attendees at each table shared their “hopes” for the assembly and tied together their own individual colored ribbons symbolizing the spirit of each community woven in unstoppable charity. The energy was

warm, loving, palpable, and unstoppable, as the evening ended with a “Welcome Reception.”

“Weaving together...” These words capture the “feeling” of the Assembly of the Whole. Five hundred fifty women religious totally committed to God and to one another, covering the world with an outpouring of the charism of Charity. And each Sister in the Assembly represented many others who could not be there. Think too of the thousands in the Company of Charity who have gone before us into the glory of eternity, yet continue to weave with us.

On Friday, June 14, Cincinnati Sister of Charity Joan Cook, President of the Federation, delivered the Presidential Report, focusing on the Federation’s “Futuring 2017 and Beyond” document, with particular emphasis on the Federation Call, which represents the evolving reality of the Federation. It reads:

“Energized by our mission and vision, our call as a federation is rooted in our commitment that we never do alone what we can do better together. Our desire is to deepen our relationships and inter-connectedness among federation congregations and within the Vincentian family and beyond. We, in our individual congregations, embrace this call as a frame of reference as we engage in our direction-setting. Acting as a whole, we celebrate our call to live into our shared future in a spirit of contemplation and prophetic action.”

Sister Peggy O’Neill, SC (Convent Station), brought her energy and lived experience to the keynote address, entitled “Love is the Answer.” Sister Peggy stated we are standing at the edge as congregations, open to new forms of incarnation. “The Sisters of Charity have evolved to never stop evolving.” She stressed everything is connected. “We have the DNA of our creator. We live in each other and love

passes through each other. We come from love and are moving toward a more inclusive love.” Sister Peggy suggested the Family of Charity will continue to widen as we give ourselves away so that we can connect with others and God.

Sister Peggy’s words elicited interesting questions from her audience as well as in dynamic lunchtime conversations. Sister Vivien Linkhauer was one of the panelists who expressed insights, posed questions, and engaged in discussion with Sister Peggy.

Through the use of technology, Sister Sujita Kallapurakkathu, the global leader of the Sisters of Notre Dame, a religious community of 2,400 nuns serving in 17 nations, gave a recorded reflection from India on the events of the day. She ended her reflection by urging, “Look at the beautiful roots of your unstoppable charity.” The day closed with liturgy.

This assembly was not so much a gathering to gain more knowledge, learn new methods or practice innovative techniques, but rather an experience of the pulsating Spirit of Charity that permeated and united in instant rapport the 550 participants from nine countries, who spoke eleven different languages. . . . The presence of this unique Spirit made everything so present, so immediate: the welcome; the facilitators; keynote speaker; the panelists; the reflector, and especially the discussions at table followed by reporting to the whole. Throughout the entire assembly the call to live unstoppable charity, spending ourselves in love for others especially the poor, while discovering new creative ways, challenged us, as together we face the future with hope. We were reminded that together we can do more than we can alone; that we are called to holiness; that we are women of contemplation engaged in prophetic action, and that the world is saturated with the God of love. Sharing during meals and in between scheduled events provided opportunities to spend time with friends not seen for a while, to make new friends, and to reconnect with other old friends.

After the opening prayer led by Sister Regina Bechtel, SC (New York), the Saturday morning session of June 15 began with “Vignettes of Unstoppable Charity,” a compilation of photos and videos contributed by communicators of the 14 Sisters of Charity Federation congregations. The compelling ministry photos and inspiring videos evoked laughter and tears, and gave a glimpse of the generosity and compassion extended by the 2,650 members of the Sisters of Charity Federation.

After the video, a resounding word surfaced at many table discussions: *presence*. Through the sisters’ presence, persons on the periphery find dignity, joy, respect, comfort, safety, learning, change, confidence, and ultimately peace. Shared reflection on the vignettes helped Federation members ponder, “How are we going out to meet Christ today?” Comments from table representatives indicated that communities of the Federation are keeping emerging ministries strong through collaboration. The faces of charity are not all alike, but members of the Federation are building deep oneness through strong intercultural relationships.

One of the most significant pieces for me was the presentation with still photos and video vignettes of “Unstoppable Charity.” My table mates and I, and I would think those at other tables, were touched by the images and stories of the presence of Charity at home and internationally. It was impossible not to smile at some, and take deep breaths in awed response to world needs and charity depicted in others. . . . So many possibilities of collaboration and shared experiences in mission and ministry are becoming clearer as the charism of Charity evolves with and in the world. The networking of religious and lay can contribute to the full picture of Charity present.

Topics for the Saturday afternoon presentations continued to explore the many ways Federation Sisters serve persons living on the margins. Sister Judy Warmbold, DC, coordinator of the DePaul USA Chicago DAX Program, shared a video about the reality of student homelessness at DePaul University in Chicago. Sister Teresa Kotturan, SCN, Federation NGO Representative at the UN, and Debbie Weber, director of Peace, Justice and Care for Creation and NGO liaison for the Sisters of Charity of Cincinnati, talked about the great work being done at the UN about ending homelessness.

A highlight of the Assembly was the Saturday night banquet that featured a robust musical performance by Harmony, Hope & Healing. The organization supports women, men and children as they heal from traumas associated with homelessness, incarceration, addiction, and isolation through music classes and workshops in shelters, residential programs, drug treatment centers, community centers and Cook County Jail. The classes and workshops teach appropriate ways to relieve stress, express emotions, and develop positive relationships. Alumni and participants from the Harmony, Hope & Healing program sites as well as volunteers make up



the sought-after singing group that shares music of hope and inspiration.

Following the performance, Sister Grace invited all of the hotel employees to come forward to the stage area with the musical performers so that the sisters could extend their hands for a prayer of blessing and gratitude. The men and women who served and entertained the Federation guests were visibly moved.

At the final dinner time I experienced a special love. When Sr. Grace Hartzog said “Sisters! Let us bless the hotel workers who supported the whole Assembly.” All the Sisters stood up and sang a blessing song with raised hands. That time was full of love and gratitude. I think it was a climax and we were showing Unstoppable Charity to our neighborhood. This Assembly clearly showed our charism for me. It was a gift!

Sunday, the last day of the assembly, began with a look at the past. The opening prayer included a Litany of Remembrance, a beautiful tribute accompanied by song for sisters who had been influential in the life of the Federation and are now deceased. Then, a videotaped reflection by Sister Sujita evoked images of the future for the Charity Federation. “Unstoppable charity begins with moments of deep silence within us where we can contemplate to see others as God sees them. . . . The heart of Charity’s calling is the love of God.”

Before the closing liturgy, members of the Federation acknowledged Sister Grace Hartzog with a standing ovation for her efforts in turning



the dream of such an assembly into a beautiful reality. Her leadership and hard work made the Assembly of the Whole a truly a unique and wonderful experience—a dream come true.

The experience of the assembly made me realize in a new, deeper level that as individuals and as a congregation we belong and are an integral part of something much bigger than we are. I have much to ponder—especially that individual sisters will pass away and our individual congregations may very well pass away. But the Charism of Charity will not pass away because charity cannot die; for God IS Charity and those who live in Charity live in God and God in them. We are living this now today and unto God's many tomorrows.

After the closing liturgy, Sisters took boxed lunches and their luggage to busses, cabs, and airport shuttles. Sister Grace said the highlight of the Assembly came for her at that time as she chatted with two elderly sisters from Canada while they waited for their airport shuttle. They were radiant with hope. Like the other 448 participants of the Assembly of the Whole, they were returning home with hearts full of hopes and dreams for the future, knowing that all together, they can do more by loving greatly.



About the noon hour on Sunday, Sisters and Daughters, Associates and colleagues gathered their luggage and bid their good byes.

They were leaving, many refreshed with different views of belonging, of sisterhood, of mission and community.

It had begun just days before with the weaving of knots, weavings and knots that were bright and colorful, characteristically connecting and diversified. It had begun at a table with faces, familiar and unfamiliar, one of seventy-five tables of Charity-proud participants. It beheld an uncertainty that was simultaneously filled with hope.

Seasoned map-makers of the Charity charism welcomed the new and the partly-seasoned among map-makers to continue the charting of this unique Charism of the Church – on roads that have many times been paved and re-paved, on unknown lanes and still muddy paths, on crowded street corners, in rural squares on speedy interstates and perhaps some day aboard rockets heading into unknown space.

INTERVIEW WITH James P. McQuade

This is the tenth in a series of *Celebration* interviews that applaud the remarkable accomplishments of some of our friends, contributors, partners, and volunteers. These are people who in some way demonstrate a great appreciation for their communities and for the mission of the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill. This interview is with James P. “Jim” McQuade, a longtime benefactor of the Sisters of Charity and alumnus of the former St. Anselm School in Swissvale. After graduating from St. Anselm, Jim attended Central Catholic High School in Pittsburgh, followed by a stint in the army. Thereafter, he married and attended Duquesne University. Sister Beatrice McQuade, SC., is his older sister, whom he visits frequently at Caritas Christi. Jim is a man marked by great wit and generosity, demonstrated by his creation of many education scholarships throughout the region, particularly at Seton Hill University and Duquesne University.



Q: Jim, the first time I met you at DePaul Center, I knew you were the type of guy who would love a copy of *The Snowball*, *Warren Buffett and the Business of Life* by Alice Schroeder. It’s one of the funniest books I’ve ever read and with your experience and success in sales, I knew you could relate to the “Sage of Omaha.” You laugh, but, in your career, what is the key to being successful in sales?

A: Outsell everyone else.

Q: How logical. Sounds like Buffett! Tell me about your career.

A: After I was discharged from the Army in 1956, I started to work at the Edgar Thomson steel mill. I worked night and afternoon shifts, joined the union, and went to Duquesne University during the day. I was married and had two sons. I studied business administration.

Q: I see you always wear your red Duquesne ring. Why did you decide to go there?

A: Well, I knew two guys who impressed me. One owned the Atlantic station in Swissvale. His red ring was so worn he could hardly wear it. He was an usher at church and was on the Swissvale council. The other guy I really admired, who wore the red ring was, shall I say, of slightly dubious background. But he always gave me a ride when I needed a lift!

Q: And after graduation, where did you end up?

A: Braun Baking Company. Do you remember Town Talk and Wonder Bread? I sold bread and cakes and pies to Mom & Pops, as well as to chains like Kroger, Thoroughfare, and A&P—you name it. I joined the Teamsters, worked 12-hour days in sales, traveled 50,000 miles a year. And by age 35, I was burnt out. So I left. Everyone told me I’d lose out by leaving such a good job with the benefits, but I went ahead and started with The Gillette Company in 1969. I told everyone who couldn’t believe I left Braun that I only ever had a two week contract! So, I ended up at Gillette selling toiletries for a living, things like Rite Guard, Soft’n Dry, and Mink Shampoo.

Q: And evidently you outsold everyone else.

A: When I interviewed for the Gillette job, two hundred people had applied. After I got it, I asked, “Why you did you pick me?” I guess because I’m a nice guy.

Q: Well, you make it sound easy but I imagine very well that sales are pretty demanding.

A: You have to know when to move and when to hold back.

Q: Are you competitive?

A: No, not particularly. I don’t even like to play games. My kids always whipped me at checkers and the like.

Q: Are you a big risk taker?

A: Oh no, not at all. But you know Gillette was a good company. Then, when they merged with Proctor & Gamble, with all those stock splits and whatnot, I did well.

Q: Were you brilliant academically?

A: (laughter) No way. I like to say I earned gentlemen “Cs”. At St. Anselm, it was all fear, guilt, and intimidation (laughter). You had to walk the line all day. Our house was just across the street. My sister Bea was much older. As for Central Catholic, you know, it was another stepping stone, good education, good discipline.

Q: How did you get into philanthropy? You’ve endowed many scholarships.

A: Well it was as if I had this printing press in my cellar, and I thought well, you know, the cat died, so I can’t leave it to the cat! And I like Seton Hill University and the Sisters, and of course Duquesne. I especially enjoy meeting the students who use the money. The schools have these luncheons. Here’s some of the letters I’ve received. Here’s one from JoAnne Boyle. I started scholarships named for my family, for my wife’s family, for my parents, for my best friend who died, and one for three doctors who saved my life. I started a scholarship through the Crossroads Foundation from the James P. McQuade Family to benefit a St. Vincent student. Crossroads is designed to help underserved kids from Allegheny County with their education. That was in 1999. I also provided funding for two of Rick Seback’s films on Pittsburgh: “Things That Are Still Here” and “Something About Oakland.”

Q: Film? How did you get involved in that?

A: I met Rick Seback and liked him and his work at WQED. He’s a really genuine, down to earth, authentic guy.

Q: I understand from your wife Mary Ann that you like to travel. What’s one of the best trips you’ve ever had?

A: One of them was a Tiger Cruise in 1995. My son Paul was in the U.S. Navy, and he served aboard the USS Abraham Lincoln. I was invited to sail on a Tiger Cruise. There were over 1000 guests onboard. You get a daily schedule. It was just great. All sorts of relatives could qualify to go. Here’s my certificate signed by Captain Robert F. Willard, Commanding Officer.

Q: Oh, my goodness, the great Aircraft Carrier, “Abe”, christened on 11 November, 1988, 332.8 meters long, carries 90 fixed wing and helicopters! Did you get to stand on the deck and see planes taking off?

A: Yes and landing at the same time. You won’t believe the sound. The ship came into Pearl Harbor from the Persian Gulf, and we sailed from Pearl Harbor through the Molokai Channel.

Q: Oh, what a thrilling trip! Tell me, who is a person in your life who exerted a strong spiritual influence on you?

A: Well, I liked Father Tom Smith. They called him the Dancing Priest. A lot of the sisters here would remember him.

Q: Thank you, Jim. You’ve had quite a life in Pittsburgh, and it has been fun to spend time with you. I can see why you were so successful in sales!

In the Winter 2019 issue of Celebration, Sisters Edie Strong and Barbara Einloth invited our readers to help us to care for the earth by participating in an eco-justice project. Many readers helped to make the project a success. Through the generosity of Sisters of Charity of the United States and Korean Provinces and their benefactors, a small forest will be planted in Mongolia to combat desertification, the process that causes fertile land to turn into desert, incapable of supporting life.

Funds raised through the “Planting Trees in Mongolia” campaign were presented at a ceremony that took place at the Korean Government building in Seoul, Korea, on May 28, 2019. Sister Marie Theresa Rishel, representing the U.S Province, Sisters Sun Yun Lim and Jae Soon Choi, representing the Korean Province, and two staff members from the Korean Forestry Office were present. About 870 persons participated in the campaign that began on January 17, 2019, and ended Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019. Enough funds were raised for the sisters to present a gift of 2,734 trees.

The two staff members of the Forestry Office studied about our Congregation through our web pages before the meeting. They spoke English well, making the conversation easy. The sisters asked many questions and the staff answered them. The place where the trees will be planted is the “Forest of the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill and Benefactors” in the “Forest City” in Ulaanbaatar, the capital city of Mongolia. The Korean Government has

NEW BOOK

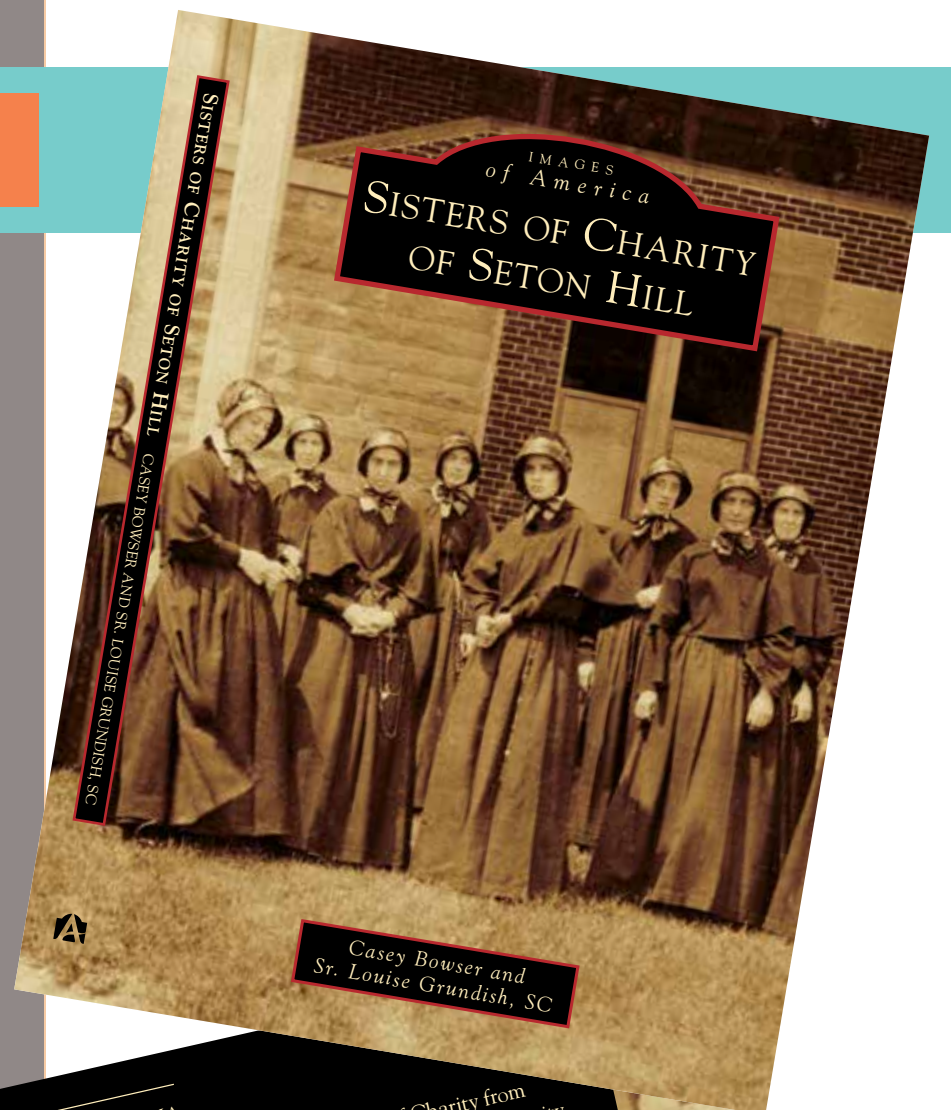

GREENSBURG, PENNSYLVANIA

In August 1870, Mother Aloysia Lowe and five Sisters of Charity from Cincinnati arrived in Altoona, Pennsylvania, to found a new community of sisters for the Diocese of Pittsburgh. Western Pennsylvania, with its throngs of newly immigrated Catholics and burgeoning industry, witnessed the growth of parishes and quality schools. Mother Aloysia purchased a 200-acre property in Greensburg in 1882 to accommodate the growing community. It became known as Seton Hill. The Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill, following in the footsteps of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, St. Vincent de Paul, and St. Louise de Marillac, have dedicated their lives in service of others. From the establishment of groundbreaking educational institutions, including Seton Hill University, to the operation of advanced health care facilities and vital social service programs, the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill influenced the lives of thousands of Americans. The pioneering spirit of these Sisters of Charity, evidenced in their expansive mission work in Arizona, California, and Louisiana, culminated in 1960 with a mission to Korea. The Korean Province and the United States now unite the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill as an international congregation. Casey Bowser, archivist for the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill, holds a degree in history from St. Vincent College and a degree in museum studies from Johns Hopkins University. Sr. Louise Grundish, archivist emerita, dedicated her life to health care and nursing education. She has enjoyed 68 years as a Sister of Charity.

SETON ARTS SERVICE CORPS STUDENT BECOMES A SETON ARTS SCHOLAR

Haley Coscarelli, a junior music therapy student at Seton Hill University knows the joy of having a dream come true. She lived her dream this summer by sharing her joy and creativity with elementary students who attended Seton Arts Service Corps Summer Art Camp at Caritas Christi. Once a student participant with Seton Arts, Haley is now a Seton Arts Scholar who shares her music skills with a new generation of young students.

When Haley was a middle school student at Mary Queen of Apostles School, New Kensington, Pennsylvania, she attended two eight-week sessions of Saturday Seton Arts classes. She had great fun developing new skills in self-expression through the arts with Seton Hill Scholars. After participating in the program, Haley knew she wanted to attend Seton Hill as a music student and become a Seton Hill Scholar. She seized opportunities to develop her musical talent to make that aspiration a reality. She sang at church with the children's choir, served as a cantor at her parish, and studied voice and piano with local church musicians and former Seton Arts mentors.

Haley achieved her first big goal when she began classes at Seton Hill in the Fall of 2017. Then in the Spring of 2019, she was given an opportunity to serve as a substitute scholar for Seton Arts. The rest of her dream became a reality when Seton Arts Service Corps Director Sister Kathleen McGrady asked her to be a music teacher for the Seton Arts Summer Camp held last June.

"I love working with kids," exclaimed Haley. "Here I am! And now I have the privilege of being a Seton Hill Scholar and



co-teach the music class in this program." Haley has an ability to put herself in the place of her students in order to understand how to share her love of music with them. She also enjoys working with the other scholars under the direction with Sister Kathleen and Sister Mary Kay Neff. "It is a good experience for the scholars—awesome, passionate collaboration," says Haley.

Through her experience with Seton Arts as a student and as a scholar, Haley has developed a clear understanding of how self-expression through the arts opens doors to fulfilling opportunities. She has observed that many families do not have the means to provide music lessons. Programs such as Seton Arts are a great way to provide experience

with music, art, and drama to under-served children. "Making friends in the program is a good way to get to know new people. I love to see shyness fade as kids come out of their shells."

Gratitude for her own opportunities has been a motivator for Haley. She had the opportunity to meet Carole and Glenn Johnson on the final day of the Seton Arts Service Corps summer camp. The Johnsons have been generous supporters of Seton Arts in honor of their daughter Beth Ann, a Seton Hill student who died tragically in the 1988 PanAm 103 bombing over Lockerbie, Scotland. Beth Ann loved the arts and played 14 different instruments. "I am so grateful to have met the Johnsons. They are amazing people. I am glad I was able to thank them in person for

their support of the arts and helping children from lower-income households to have access to learning about the arts. Beth Ann is not forgotten, and her memory lives on through her parents' generosity toward supporting the arts."

Haley does not know for sure where she would like to work when she graduates and becomes board certified in 2021. She does know for certain that she wants to work with children. There is no doubt that Haley will be a credit to her Alma Mater in demonstrating a broad understanding of the role of the arts in addressing community needs, and using her music-making skills to continue the traditions of service of the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill.

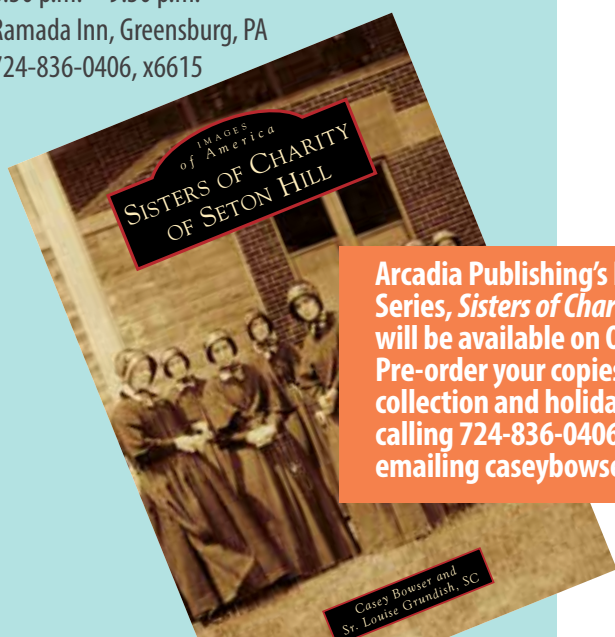
